

Uniform Policy

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Purpose

The College uniform aims to be affordable, durable, practical, and comfortable. At Dunsborough Christian College (DCC) we believe that a uniform serves several practical, social, and economic purposes. These include:

- 1. **Community and Identity**: Wearing a uniform is one of the ways we foster a sense of belonging and being part of a unique community.
- Safety and Comfort: Our school uniform has been carefully selected to ensure students will be comfortable and safe while playing, exploring the bush or engaging in the school curriculum. A uniform also assists in ensuring our students can be easily identified while on school excursions or partaking in community events.
- 3. **Equality and Unity**: School uniforms can help to create a more inclusive environment by creating a sense of equality among students, regardless of their socio-economic background.
- 4. **Focus on Learning**: Uniforms help to minimise distractions which are often related to the wearing of accessories or the pressure to keep up to date with the latest fashion trends.
- 5. **Time Management**: Wearing a uniform can reduce student and parent conflict by eliminating the need to decide what to wear each day.
- 6. **Preparation for the Workplace**: Wearing uniforms can instil a sense of self-discipline by preparing students for future work environments where a dress code is required.

Scope

This policy applies to all students of Dunsborough Christian College. We acknowledge that parents and caregivers have an important role to play in ensuring students arrive at school wearing the College uniform in a clean, neat, and tidy manner.

Sports Uniform

Kindy-Year 2 College Sports Uniform Includes:

- College polo shirt
- College navy shorts
- College navy track pants with padded knees
- College sports jacket
- College hat
- · College navy crew socks
- Predominately navy, white or black sneakers (Velcro or lace up)

Years 3-12 As above, except College navy trackpants with no padded knees

Formal Uniform

Years 3-12 Formal College Uniform Includes:

- College sand cotton drill shirt
- (The College shirt to be tucked in. Sleeves may be rolled halfway up or down).
- College navy cargo pants/cargo shorts/skirt
- College sports jacket
- · College hat
- · College navy crew socks
- Black ankle boots with an elastic side (heel height to be a maximum 3 cm)

Sports Shoes

Students are to wear matching velcro or laced sneakers which are predominantly white, black or navy. Sports shoes must be suitable for running and playing sport. Therefore hiking, slip-on or skate shoes are not permitted.

The Physical Education Teacher/s may require students to wear specialist soccer/football/basketball shoes for a set period of time. If specialist shoes are required, students must only wear these shoes during Physical Education lessons or interschool events. Information will be forwarded to parents/carers when this is required.







Formal Shoes

Students are to wear **plain black** or **dark brown** leather or leather look **ankle** boots with elastic sides. Brown, tan or other coloured boots are not permitted. Boots with a zip, bling, buckles, sheep skin, faux fur, logos or coloured stitching are not permitted. Therefore, Doc Martins, motorcycle, Ugg, hiking boots or snow boots are not permitted. The heel height is to be no greater than 3 cm. If students require greater ankle support, an approved black lace up boot is permitted.





A plain black, navy or dark brown leather or leather look sandal may be worn with the formal uniform for primary students only. The sandal must have a rear strap and be secure on the child's foot. The sole must be black, navy or tan in colour. Socks are NOT to be worn with the sandal. High school students are not permitted to wear sandals as some subjects require safety standards to be maintained.





Hair Styles

Neat and tidy hairstyles are expected across the campus. Hair below the collar is to be tied up with navy, black, white or green hair ribbons, ties or scrunchies. Hairclips and headbands should reflect the student's natural hair colour or school colours. Fringes are to be no longer than the student's eyebrows. Headbands must not be worn over any part of the student's ears or forehead. Hairstyles such as dreadlocks, shaved heads (less than blade 2), mohawks, etc. are not permitted.

Hair Colour

Primary School students are not permitted to colour/dye their hair. Secondary School students may only use natural hair colours and tones within a close range of the student's natural hair colour. This means that bright colours such as blue and pink, two-tones or striped hair colours are not acceptable.

Facial Hair

Students in Year 11 and 12 are permitted to wear a **full** beard or moustache which is neatly trimmed. The College reserves the right to ask students to shave facial hair if is not fully developed or the beard or moustache are overly stylised.

Jewellery

Wristwatch

Students are permitted to wear a sports or casual watch. Dress watches are not permitted. Where a watch causes disruption in class (e.g. an audible alarm, or causing distraction to the student), it will be treated as a device and the ICT Policy will be applied. Smartwatches are not permitted at school.

Earrings

Students are permitted to wear a **single** plain gold, rose gold or silver sleeper or stud in each lower earlobe. Studs should be no larger than 0.5 cm in diameter and may include gemstones or pearls. Round shapes are permitted but not butterflies, stars, hearts, squares, kites, etc. Sleepers should be no larger than 1.5 cm in diameter. All earrings, including those immediately following ear piercing, must follow these specifications no exceptions will be permitted.

<u>For safety reasons no other items of jewellery are permitted</u>*. This includes necklaces, bracelets, finger rings, nose rings, anklets, and other external piercings. Students may also be required to remove earrings or watches prior to lessons in Physical Education, Manual Arts or Home Economics.

^{*}Exceptions are granted for students with medical conditions such as a medical response braclet.

Tattoos

Students are not permitted to draw on themselves and attend school with real or fake tattoos.

Makeup

Primary School students are not permitted to wear makeup, unless directed by the Head of School, e.g. drama production. Secondary School students are permitted to wear skin colour foundation and clear lip gloss/lip balm. Eye-makeup is not permitted, and students are prohibited from wearing false eyelashes or eyelash extensions.

Fingernails

Students are expected to keep their nails clean with the free edge of the nail no longer than 5mm. Students may wear clear nail varnish. Coloured nail varnish or false nails are not permitted.

Cultural Identity

The College recognises that some students may be expected to wear certain types of clothing and headwear such as turbans or head scarves as part of their religious beliefs or cultural traditions. In consultation with the Head of School, cultural items may be permitted if they do not impede the wearing of the school uniform or obscure the face. Formal approval must be given by the Head of School as part of the enrolment process.

Undergarments

The College recognises that some students may wish to wear a vest, singlet or camisole for warmth and comfort. These items are permissible, provided no part of the garment is visible. The under garment should be white or a neutral colour, with no visible colours, patterns or emblems showing through the school uniform. Long sleeve shirts under the school uniform is not permitted. If students are cold, the school jacket is to be worn. Students are not permitted to wear costumes or other items of clothing under their uniform.

Stockings/Leggings

The College recognises that some students feel the cold, however the uniform has been carefully selected to ensure students remain warm during the cooler weather. If a student is cold, they are expected to wear the College tracksuit jacket with their tracksuit pants (sports uniform days) or cargo pants (formal uniform days). Therefore, leggings, stockings, tights, and skins are not permitted.

Raincoats

On wet days students are permitted to wear a raincoat to school, from school and during recess and lunch. Parents are to provide students with a suitable raincoat. Students will not be granted permission to play in the rain unless they have a raincoat and gumboots. Raincoats are not to be worn in the classroom.

Gumboots

Parents are to supply their child with a pair of clearly labelled gum boots. This item will remain at school for the duration of the school year. Gum boots are to be returned to the student at the end of the year. If the student outgrows a pair of boots during the academic year, each class has spare boots which can be swapped over.

Beanies, Scarves, Gloves and Sunglasses

Students may wear beanies, scarves, gloves, or sunglasses to and from school. Once students are at school, they are not permitted to wear these items in or out of the classroom.

Hats

Only the College hat is permitted. It is to be worn in an appropriate manner when outside the classroom during Term 1 and Term 4. On warm spring or autumn days, students are encouraged to wear the College hat or apply suncream.

School, Library, Headphone and Laptop Bags

Parents are to provide a suitable school bag, waterproof library bag, waterproof headphone bag and padded laptop bag (if applicable). Students benefit from a school bag with adjustable shoulder straps, rear padding and separate compartments to assist with packing. Secondary students who are required to bring their own device (BYOD), are encouraged to use a suitable padded laptop bag to transport their device.

Leavers T-Shirts and Jacket

At the beginning of Year 6, students will have the option of purchasing a Year 6 leavers polo shirt. This item may be worn instead of the College polo shirt. At the beginning of Year 12 students will have the option of purchasing a Year 12 leavers jacket. This item may be worn instead of the College sports jacket.

Sports Uniform Days

Students from Year 3-12 will be expected to wear their sports uniform for a minimum of two days per week. The days will be determined by the Head of School based upon student timetables.

Formal Uniform Days

Students from Year 3-12 will be expected to wear their formal uniform for a minimum of two days per week. The days will be determined by the Head of School based upon student timetables.

Uniform Breaches

At the start of each term, parents and students will be reminded of uniform expectations through the school newsletter and Monday meetups. Classroom and Form Teachers will follow the school's Behavioural Policy for any uniform breaches.
